The Setting (Isaiah 7:1 – 2, as well as 2 Kings 16 and 2 Chronicles 28)

- → Ahaz is king of Judah (735 715 BC) "followed the detestable practices of the pagan nations"
- → Judah is attacked by four nations simultaneously

The Choice

 \rightarrow God tells King Ahaz not to _____ about those enemies (7:3 – 9)

Unless your faith is firm, I cannot make you stand firm(v. 9)

→ A sign: ______. (7:10 – 25)

 \rightarrow The coming _____ (8:1-10)

→ Trust in _____ (8:11 – 22)

Yahweh has given me a strong warning not to think like everyone else does (v 11)



Dig Deeper: Who is Immanuel in Isaiah 7:14?

- → "sign" = physical evidence of spiritual reality
- → = עַלְמָה Almah = young woman who is betrothed
- \rightarrow Septuagint (Greek OT from 250 BC) translates the word as "virgin"
- → Four possibilities
 - 1. Jesus (Matt 1:23)
 - 2. Isaiah's second son
 - 3. Ahaz's good son Hezekiah
 - 4. A child to be born of a woman at the river (betrothed wife of Ahaz)
- Note: "Fulfilled" in the New Testament can mean to "fill it up", or to add a layer of meaning to something said before
